Travel and Camp on Durable Surfaces: Create a Trail

Objective:

- To understand how to use and recreate a proper trail on “durable surfaces” that can be applied in the wild lands.

Materials needed:

- -Chairs, desks.
- -Labels in kit.
- -String.

Instructions:

- This activity can be done either inside or outside. Have students create a trail from one corner of the room to the opposite corner. Give some students and/or classroom furniture the labels and use them as obstacles (students can lay on ground or stand) in the path. Students should find the best way to get from Point A to Point B while disturbing as little of the “natural” landscape as possible and use the string to mark the trail. Remind students the path should be narrow and walked on in a single file. Discuss how this applies to the Leave No Trace Principle 2: Travel and Camp on Durable Surfaces.
