Long ago during the Ice Age, Lake Lahontan was created. This massive body of water covered the northern and western parts of Nevada, with an inflow from the Carson, Walker, and Truckee Rivers from the west and the Humboldt River from the east. Through the years Lake Lahontan has left the remnant lakes of Carson, Humboldt, Winnemucca, Walker, and Pyramid. Currently Walker and Pyramid, the deeper of the two, are the only permanent lakes. The rest have deteriorated into playa lakes or playas. A playa is a flat-floored bottom of an un-drained desert basin. Some playas have deposits of salt or gypsum.



The Playa of the Black Rock Desert is located north of Gerlach, NV. It can be reached from Highway 34 or Jungo Road. The Playa can be used as a shortcut to reach The Black Rock Desert. Caution if the ground is wet or soft stay off the road to avoid getting stuck in the mud!
