PYRAMID LAKE PAIUTE KIT



◆ WE ARE ALL PEOPLE OF THIS EARTH

”Fremont named the great blue lake in the desert after the large pyramid, then an island, which rises several hundred feet from the water. Nearly midway along the eastern shore, it is the lake’s most prominent feature. By the late 1960’s, the wasting water supply finally connected the pyramid to the eastern shore-land by exposing a threadlike strip of rock and sand that will continue to widen as the rest of the encircling blue water slips away from the legendary rock. The earlier Paiutes attributed strange powers and circumstances to the formation and regarded it as the home of good and evil spirits.” (Herman pg 9)

The road to The Stone Mother and The Pyramid is 8 miles north of the 447/446 Junction. From route 447 North, head west at the sign after mile marker 23, this dirt road goes approximately 7 miles to The Pyramid and The Stone Mother on the left side. Be sure to obtain a permit once traveling off route 447!
